Though it is slow at first, with the arrival of the sixth doctor the tale starts rolling. The author captures Collin Baker's character very well, and it is nice to find the doctor initially traveling without a companion. But he does team up with the Brigadier, who shines through the pages also. But no spoilers. You can see the basic premise of this book else where in the description, so I wont go into it here, but will simply say this is a good find for a casual Colin Baker fan. There are unfortunately
