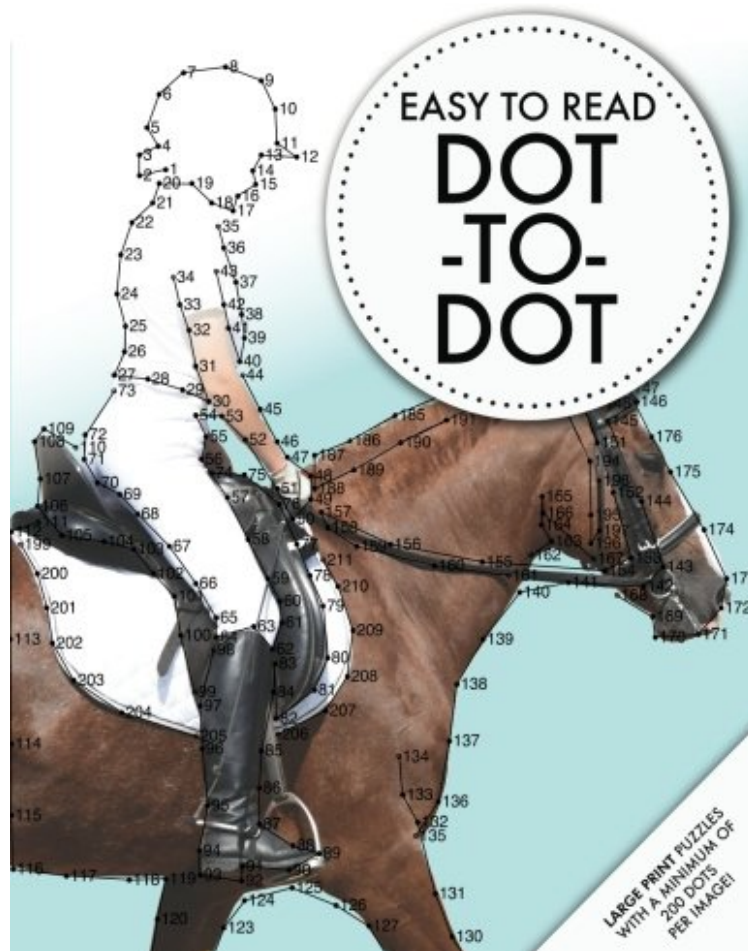

You should then look for the next dot which will also be hollow (white) and draw a new line starting there. We've shown an example of this inside the book. Solutions are featured towards the back of the book if you'd like a sneak peek before revealing the finished puzzle!
