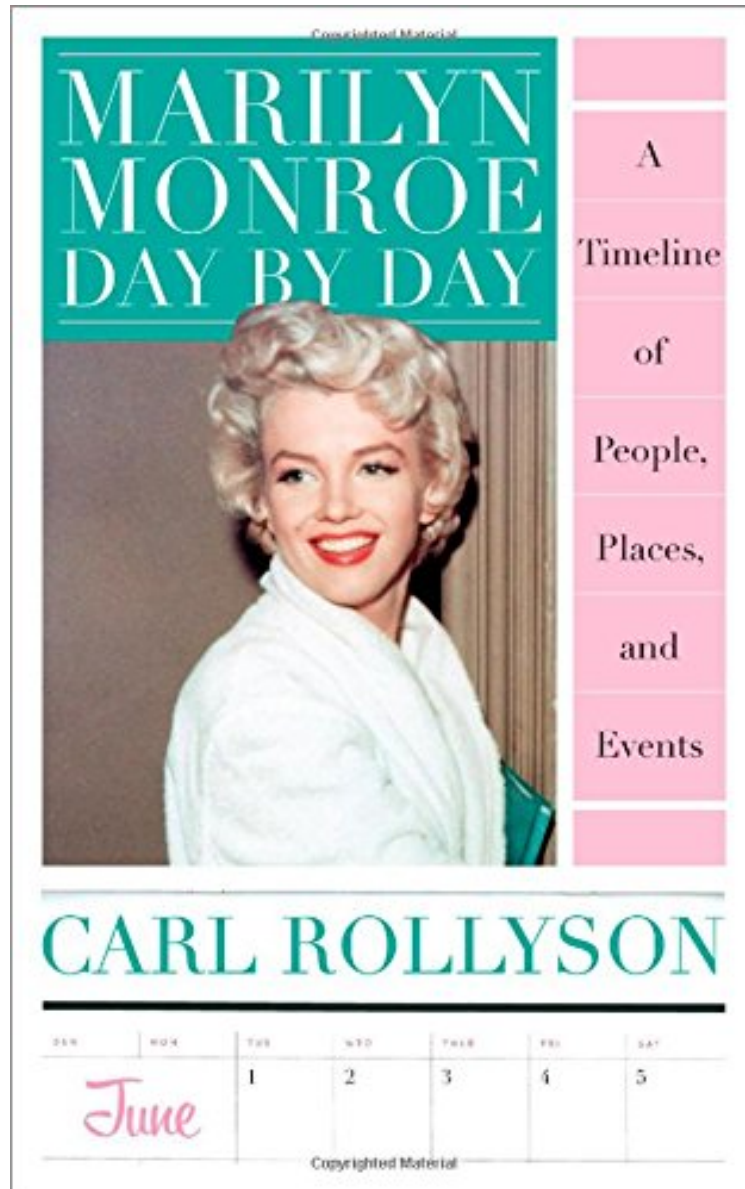

Doesn't live up to potentialBy Celebrity editorThere is definitely a need for a published timeline of Marilyn Monroe's life, but "Marilyn Monroe Day By Day" does not seem to live up to its potential. Since Rollyson focused strictly on Marilyn's film career in his previous book on her, that may be the reason this timeline of Marilyn's life is incomplete. To start off, a 6.5 page brief biography of Marilyn's life is offered at the beginning of the book. This negates the obvious purpose of the book which is to expand in detail each year of her life. This "Brief History of Marilyn Monroe" offers a disjointed summary of Monroe's life and even contains a glaring error citing the incorrect year that her nude calendar photo scandal took place. As stated on the book's sleeve, the "Brief History" was included to provide "context" to Marilyn's life. Therein lies the problem with the entire book. A timeline should, within itself, provide context of the subject's life by including relevant descriptions of each event when necessary. That is something that "Day By Day" overwhelmingly fails to do. Understandably, there are events that took place where the author may not have been able to determine the specific month when they occurred. However, these events are just listed at the beginning of the year they took place in random order causing confusion for the reader. For example, in 1954 - the year that Marilyn married Joe DiMaggio - the first entry listed under 1954 is: "Marilyn uses the name Norma Baker when she checks into a Westwood motel." Huh? This event comes out of left field. There is no relevance to time or significance in her life. The main event in her life in 1954 is her marriage and divorce to Joe DiMaggio. Why was this insignificant event included with absolutely no context? And that's just one of many random events listed that seem irrelevant to the overview of Marilyn's life. Also included are an abundance of publication dates of magazines from around the world with no explanation of their significance to Marilyn's life or career. These entries act more like filler content. With Day by Day, we have the first draft of a Marilyn Monroe timeline, but, sadly, there is much more work that still needs to be done. From hefty biographies and fact-based novels to photograph collections and memoirs, more books have been written about Marilyn Monroe than any other female over the past century. However, no biography regardless how authoritative can contain all of the facts and events of an individual's life, and Marilyn is no exception. In *Marilyn Monroe Day by Day: A Timeline of People, Places, and Events*, Carl Rollyson provides a documentary approach to the life and legend of this singular personality. With details of her childhood, her young adult years, her ascent to superstardom, and the hour by hour moments leading to her tragic early death, this volume supplements and, in some cases, corrects the accounts of previous biographies. In addition to restoring what is left out in other narratives about Marilyn's life, this book also illuminates the gaps and discrepancies that still exist in our knowledge of her. Drawing on excerpts from her diaries, journals, letters, and even checks and receipts as well as reports of others Rollyson recreates the day-to-day world of a woman who still fascinates us more than fifty years after her death. In addition to the calendar, Rollyson also profiles important figures in Marilyn's life and includes a brief biography of the actress, providing a context for the timeline. An annotated bibliography of books and websites highlights the most reliable sources about Marilyn. With its vivid recreation of the key events in her life, *Marilyn Monroe Day by Day* is the perfect book for fans who can't get enough of this cultural icon.
