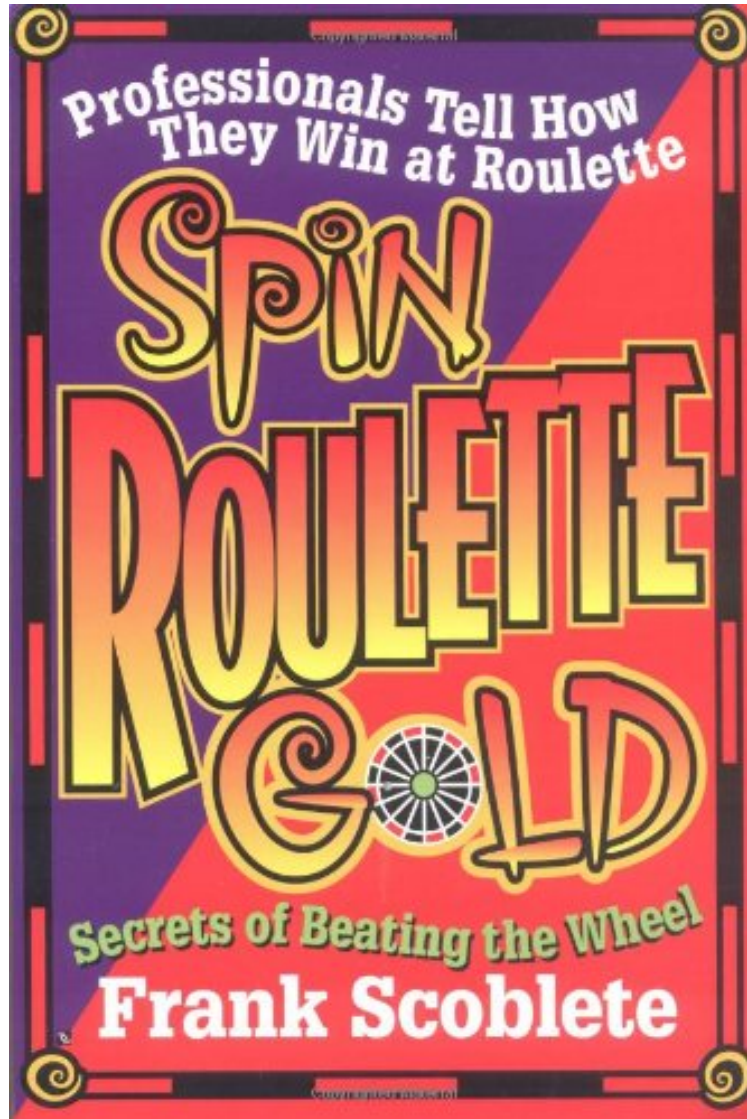

The only money Mr. Scoblete makes related to roulette is through sales of his books--he clearly has no idea how to "Spin Roulette Gold." First, Frank tells the reader about all the well-known strategies that don't work in the long run, commonly called "systems." After stating the obvious about how they don't work, he then proceeds to say you should go ahead and play these other systems (that don't work either), giving you a little hope that you might have a distant chance of winning. Don't waste your time with this nonsense. A "dealer's signature" is a short run of spins where it appears the dealer has some sort of consistent spin technique. By the time you recognize it, it's too late to profit. And don't expect the dealer to spin that way the next time. But even worse, looking for a biased wheel is about as loony an idea as anyone can think of. If you believe in biased wheels in this day and age, you probably still believe in Santa Claus (sorry kids for the spoiler). The most laughable part of the book (and a great way to use a lot of pages and turn a lack of real knowledge into a book) is his list of recorded spins from some "old" wheel trying to prove a bias. A real bias would require 100,000 to a million spins, and Scoblete doesn't even come close. Read this book at your own risk, although following any of his advice could cost you a lot of heartache and financial loss. But if you want real sound information on why you can't mathematically beat roulette, go over to WizardOfOdds.com and read about roulette from someone who knows something about math.
