Einhorn I was not very familiar with this subject, and this book covered all the basics. 1 - messing up defenders signaling, especially Attitude, on trick one 2 - false carding (playing an interior middle card to mislead the defenders) 3 - sacrificing a winner to get the defenders to continue the suit 4 - attacking a weak suit, ducking I think this book is best used as a warm up for more advanced books on false carding such as those by Mike Lawrence (False Cards) and Hugh Kelsey (Tricky Game). I plan on rereading it in a year. Its a good solid book.
