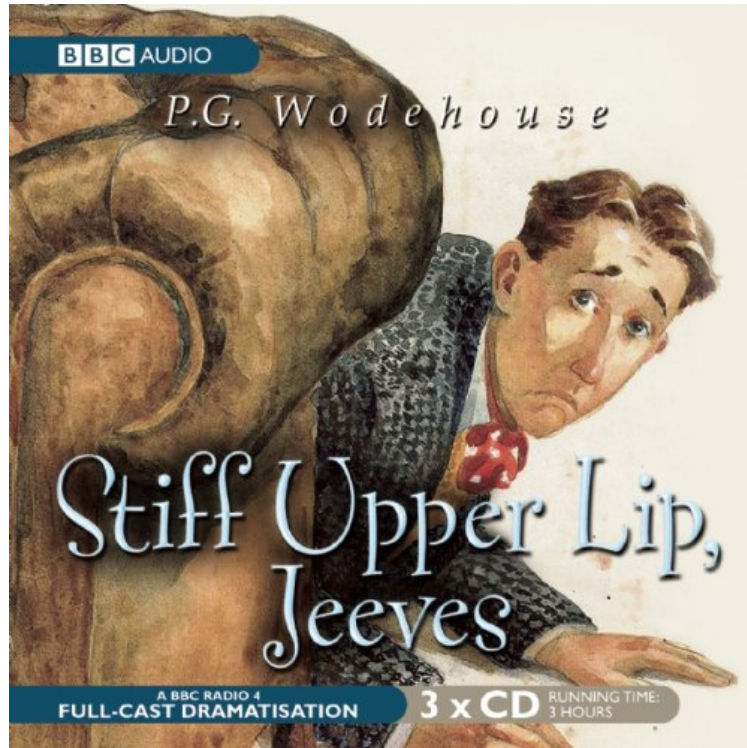

Wodehouse wrote a string of hilarious novels and short stories about the idly wealthy young London Clubman Bertie Wooster and his gentlemen's gentleman, Jeeves, and their progress through mid-century British society. "Stiff Upper Lip, Jeeves" was written towards the end of the string but finds Bertie and Jeeves in top form. Bertie goes off to dreaded Totleigh Towers to save the engagement of best buddy Gussie Fink-Nottle. Bertie has an ulterior motive: If Gussie doesn't marry the rather dim-witted Madeline Bassett, Bertie may be forced into his place. Bertie's trip is a running disaster, ending up with Bertie facing the alternative of jail or marriage, and relying, as usual, on Jeeves to bail him out of yet another tricky situation. The Bertie and Jeeves stories have held up extremely well as entertaining reads. Wodehouse's gentle satire is still excellent. Some familiarity with upper class English society and manners is useful in understanding the plot, but not absolutely required.
